


Taiwan Emergency Medicine Residency Observership Project (TEMROP)



Connecting Emergency Medicine Residents Worldwide

The Taiwan Emergency Medicine Residency Observership Project (TEMROP), initiated by the Taiwan Society of Emergency Medicine (TSEM), is dedicated to fostering global exchange, broadening the international perspectives of emergency medicine residents, and enhancing Taiwan's presence in the global emergency medicine community.

TEMROP provides an accessible, centralized information platform for international emergency medicine residents interested in observership opportunities in Taiwan. By consolidating application details from participating hospitals, the program streamlines the application process and lowers entry barriers for international applicants. In collaboration with leading emergency medicine organizations worldwide, the program is actively promoted at major international conferences, encouraging residents from around the globe to explore clinical and educational experiences in Taiwan.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- **Global Collaboration:** Partnering with international emergency medicine societies to enhance bilateral relationship.
- **Centralized Application Portal:** A single platform offering comprehensive, upto-date observership information from hospitals across Taiwan.
- **Flexible Scheduling:** Standard observership duration is four weeks (one month), with options to tailor experiences across multiple hospitals.
- Dedicated Support: Participating hospitals provide detailed application guidelines, course plans, fee structures, and contact points, as well as on-site support for international residents.





APPLICATION PROCESS

International residents interested in TEMROP are required to:

- Submit the necessary application documents directly to the selected hospital's contact person within the designated application period.
- Assume full financial responsibility for all costs related to the observership.
- Maintain proactive communication with the selected hospital and comply with all relevant regulations in Taiwan and the hospital's internal policies.

At the conclusion of the observership, participants are encouraged to provide feedback and a reflection report to the host hospital and TSEM to support the ongoing refinement and development of the program.
